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ANZIIF and APARI sign agreement recognising certificate and membership levels

The Australian and New Zealand Institute of Insurance and Finance (ANZIIF) has signed an agreement with the Association of Indonesian Qualified Insurance and Reinsurance Brokers (APARI) that will see APARI graduates recognised as eligible to apply for various levels of ANZIIF membership.

APARI graduates who are qualified at either AAPAI, APAI or CIIB levels and have the required level of industry experience, will be eligible to apply for ANZIIF Affiliate, Associate or Senior Associate membership. Membership with ANZIIF includes:
